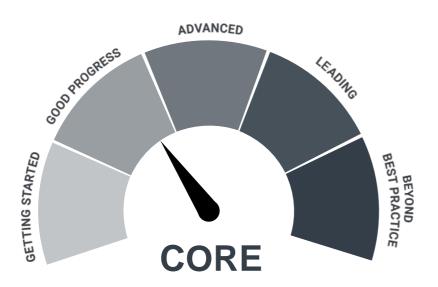

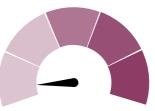

SUMMARY

For the 2019 APCO Annual Report, *A.K.C Pty Ltd* has achieved Level 2 (Good Progress) for the core criteria. LEADERSHIP: All criteria that defines leadership on packaging sustainability.

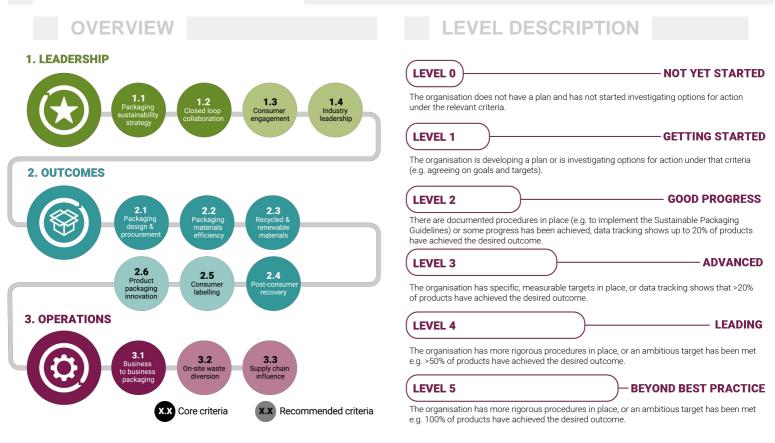
OUTCOMES: All criteria that lead to direct improvement in packaging sustainability.

ABOUT THE APCO FRAMEWORK

The APCO Packaging Sustainability Framework (the Framework) aims to provide a consistent and transparent framework for assessing and tracking packaging sustainability across organisations. The Framework consists of thirteen independent criteria that belong to three separate categories. These categories are (i) Leadership, (ii) Packaging Outcomes and (iii) Operations. The diagram above shows the different criteria included within each of these three categories.

There are two types of criteria within the Framework:

- Core criteria are mandatory and must be answered by all Members when completing the Annual Reporting Tool.
- **Recommended criteria** are not mandatory, but Members are encouraged to complete as many recommended criteria as possible.

Each criteria is divided into five levels of performance ranging from 'getting started' to 'beyond best practice'. The diagram above illustrates the key differences between performance levels. Please see www.packagingcovenant.org.au for more information.

In accordance with FM7.161 Packaging Development and Review form, to optimise the use of renewable or recyclable material in packaging. With a target of all packaging containing at least 30% renewable or recycled content by 2025.

Do you have specific targets to include on-pack labelling for disposal or recovery?

In accordance with FM7.161 Packaging Development and Review form, to ensure all packaging that comes up for reorder has the ARL on it. With a target of all packaging displaying the ARL by 2025.

Do you have specific targets to reduce on-site waste sent to landfill?
